## Why Climate Action Transparency?

- Urgency of climate action: time is running out
  - Nature of Paris Agreement: NDCs are 'nationally determined' and currently insufficient
  - Priorities of countries as driver of policy
- **Transparency efforts need to support domestic policy processes, beside creating international comparability**
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# Criteria to assess climate action effectiveness

- National development priorities: growth, job creation, social, environmental (air and water quality), etc.
- Transformational change: mobilizing investment – public (climate) resources and private finance
- GHG emission reductions towards the global policy objective (< 1.5/2° C)
- Competitiveness concerns in climate action

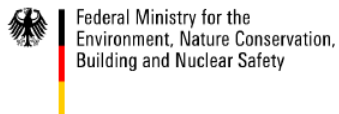
